## Artist Statement



June 16, 2006 saw the opening of the Graduation Exhibition displaying the works of a group of eight individuals who had completed the Sculpture Course at Emerson College. I was one of the graduating students, the oldest among all. That exhibition marked the end of a significant phase in my life.

The three-year full-time course at Emerson College in England was a highpoint for me, having left a stable job in Singapore at a mature age to embark on a more colourful life. I did not become a sculptor after graduating. My interesting journey continued, leading me to live in four countries in the nine years after leaving England.

To commemorate the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the event, I started to make sculptures again with clay, albeit in miniature. The works, all abstract, displayed in this exhibition reflect some aspects we learned during the course.

I hope you all enjoy the sculptures.



#### THE FOUR ELEMENTS

The purpose of studying these four elements in nature was to be able to create a sculpture that encompassed all their qualities, as far as possible. One exercise during the course was to demonstrate our understanding of each element by creating a form that display its characteristics. I have replicated this exercise, but not the sculptures.















#### **METAMORPHOSIS**

The main exhibit for my graduation was an installation of seven sculptures in plaster. It was based on the Rudolf Steiner's 'Metamorphosis' theory.

So, for this exhibition I created a new series of seven forms, different from the ones done 15 years ago.

I'll leave the viewer to interpret and appreciate the evolution of one form to another.

#### **ART INSTALLATION**

I had some reservations about this subject initially, having seen prominent artists' works in TATE MODERN, as the installations were either too profound or appeared rather silly to me. After doing a few exercises myself, though, I found it stimulating. And I learned how to make a statement through art.

The simple installation in this exhibition reflects my present state. It was assembled using materials found in nature.
